After college I went on to Brandeis University where I earned a Ph.D in Physics. I started my academic career as a professor of physics at Queens College of CUNY in 1967 and remained there until 1995 when I retired. I did research in experimental particle physics, mostly in Europe. My wife and I bought a house in Normandy, France in 1991 and resided there from 1995 until 2013 when we returned to New York. I am perfectly bilingual in French-English.
