

For over 30 years, Project Open has helped our elderly neighbors and their families.

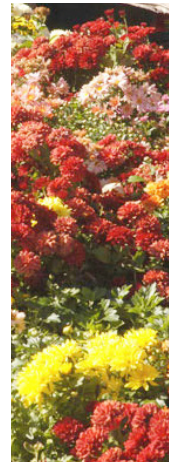
